Life University Camp General Information

Life University is committed to providing a safe environment for all youth participating in activities offered through the University. All Life University programs and camps have policies in place to ensure the safety and equal participation of youth participating in our programs. Camp staff are trained in all relevant internal, external and parental reporting protocols.

Parents are encouraged to notify the Camp Director immediately if they, or their child, are experiencing problems, difficulties or concerns with the camps, other youth in the camp, or camp staff.

Please read the Life University Sport Camps Standards of Conduct and all other important information outlined in the registration packet.

Either during registration or upon arrival to Life University, parent(s)/legal guardians(s) should plan to have all requested documents to the Camp Director or their official representative. All documents must be received prior to program participation. A complete file will include the following documents:

General Life University Camps Standards of Conduct

The following standards of conduct have been developed to help the camper gain the maximum benefit from their sport camp experience while at Life University.

Life University Non-Discrimination Policy

Life University complies with federal and state law, and does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, religion, national origin, age, sexual orientation, disability, medical condition, pregnancy, citizenship, or veteran status. The University prohibits sexual harassment as well as harassment based on any of these characteristics. This nondiscrimination policy applies to all practices at Life University, and to the admission and access to all of Life's education programs and activities.

Failure to observe the standards outlined may result in dismissal from the camp program. **Any student dismissed from a sport camp for disciplinary reasons or for failure to conform to these terms will not receive a refund.**

Standards of Conduct

- Report on time to all scheduled activities and participate in all scheduled activities.
- Only a camp staff member may grant permission to be excused from an activity.
- Permission to leave camps areas or to go off-campus must come from the Camp Director. Camp staff members must accompany campers.
- Courteous and respectful behavior is expected at all times to all camp staff and participants.
- Misuse or damage of university property is prohibited. Charges will be assessed for damage or for missing university property.
- Inappropriate use of cameras, imaging, and digital devices is prohibited. Inappropriate use includes, but is not restricted to use in showers, restrooms, or other areas where privacy is expected by participants.
- Cell phones may not be used during camp instructional sessions.
- All spectators of camp events must adhere to the Life University Fan Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct can be found here: <https://liferunningeagles.com/sports/2018/2/19/fan-code-of-conduct.aspx>

The following are strictly prohibited for all Life University camps:

- Possession and use of alcohol, tobacco, or other recreational drugs
- Possession of fireworks, guns, and other weapons
- Stealing/theft

- Violence of any kind (including, but not limited to interpersonal and/or physical or threat of physical)
- Smoking and vaping
- Hazing
- Where there are single-gender designations; campers are always expected to comply
- Life University will not be responsible for lost or stolen items
- If you are injured or ill, report to a camp staff member immediately. A camp staff member will refer medical emergencies and illnesses, as appropriate

Confidentiality agreement

Personal information about camp participants is considered confidential and may not be shared outside of camp, except as indicated in the Event Media Release Agreement. This includes the identity of campers, any demographic information, medical information and any other personally-identifiable data about any individual or group of campers. Also, the University cannot release names or phone numbers of other participants, not even to those who want to carpool.

Commuter Drop-Off and/or Pick-Up Authorization

For the safety of your child, we must have on file, a written authorization/permission form from the parent/legal guardian, of all persons permitted to pick-up your child. You may add or delete names in writing through the Camp Director at any time. Authorized individuals will be identified on last page of this document. The listed individuals will be asked to verify their identity by showing an official picture ID before your child will be released to their care.

If there are legal issues we should be aware of, please provide us with updated court documents stating such. We will abide by legal documents only when dealing with children and custody issues. Otherwise, either parent has equal rights to their child. Personal information about camp participants is considered confidential and may not be shared outside of camp. This includes the identity of campers, any demographic information, medical information and any other personally-identifiable data about any individual or group of campers.

Life University Camp Waiver of Liability/Hold Harmless Agreement

In consideration of participation in a Life University Youth Sport Camp, I hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE and COVENANT NOT TO SUE Life University and its respective officers, servants, agents, or employees (hereinafter referred to as RELEASEES) from any and all liability, claims, demands, or course of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, including death, that may be sustained by my child, or to any property belonging to my child, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEE, or otherwise, while participating in this camp, or while in, on or upon the premises where the camp is being conducted.

To the best of my knowledge, my child is in good physical condition, and I am not aware of any physical infirmity which would place my child at risk to participate in any way with the camp's activities or that reasonable accommodation(s) pursuant to and rightly procured in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Life University Office of Disabilities Services would mitigate. I am fully aware of the risks and hazards connected with this camp. I VOLUNTARILY ASSUME FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY RISK OF LOSS, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR PERSONAL INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, that may be sustained by my child, or any loss or damage to property owned by my child, as a result of being engaged in the camp's activities. I further hereby AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS, the RELEASEE, from any loss, liability, damage or cost, including court costs and attorneys' fees that may accrue related to my child's participation in the camp.

During the period of the camp, I hereby give permission for appropriately trained Life University camp staff to administer appropriate medical attention to my child in the event of any accident, illness, or injury. I will be responsible for any and all costs of medical coverage and treatment provided not covered by insurance.

Camper is responsible for the administration of their own prescription medication.

Event Media Release Agreement

I hereby authorize and give full consent to Life University to copyright and/or publish any and all photographs, videotapes, film, webcasts/podcasts, and any other form of visual/audio communications in which the camper named below appears (separately or together) while attending a Life University camp. I further agree that Life University may transfer, use or cause to be used, these above mentioned communications for any exhibitions, public displays, publications, commercials, art and advertising purposes, and television programs without limitations or reservations.

Resident Camper Policy (if applicable)

In order to support all athletes in their successful participation in Sports Camps, all campers must abide by the residential camper policy as set forth by Life University. Failure to follow these policies, and established expectations for social and residential conduct as indicated in the Life University's Code of Conduct (<https://catalog.life.edu/content.php?catoid=5&navoid=173>) may result in disciplinary action, up to and including expulsion from the camp.

Camp Residential Guidelines and Procedures

- Residential campers are required to stay in Life University's residence halls,
- Sleep in the bedroom they are assigned to which they are assigned,
- Respect the rights of roommates including, but not limited to, the right to privacy and free use of the shared room,
- Abide by curfew established by the camp director, including checking-in with camper's respective Camp Counselors/Resident Assistants every evening by the designated curfew time, and then remaining on their floor unit for the evening. Campers who are delayed in returning to their residence hall by curfew must contact a Camp Counselor by phone. Camp staff will place a call to the parents and Campus Safety regarding any camper who is more than 10 minutes late for curfew. Local Law enforcement will be contacted after 60 minutes to report a possible missing person.

Room changes or swaps are prohibited. Campers may not change their room assignment without authorization from the Camp Counselor who will determine whether a request can be accommodated.

Disability Accommodations: LIFE Sports Camps, in conjunction with Disability Services offer a range of services and accommodations to assist students with disabilities including significant allergies (including food allergies), medical conditions and temporary injuries.

Room Keys: Life University issues one room card to each resident assigned a room in a Life residence hall during Camp Hours. Campers are expected to be in possession of their room key whenever they leave the room.

Lock-outs: Campers should contact the Camp Counselor on call for their cluster if they are locked out of their room.

Report lost or stolen keys to the Camp Counselor immediately.

Key Return: All campers' keys are due immediately upon checking out of her/his room. This is necessary both for reasons of security and to allow the University to prepare the room available for the next resident. Campers receive information about where and how to return keys once on campus. Failure to return the key card immediately will result in a \$25 charge.

Visitors in Residence Halls: Campers are not permitted to have visitors in Life residence halls. Sports campers may not visit the rooms of college-age students, nor may they entertain college-age students in their rooms.

Overnight Leave: Campers may not be away from campus overnight.

Campers are responsible for the condition of their rooms and hallways, and will be held liable, individually or jointly, for damaged or missing University property. Camp Counselor Staff including Life University and visiting coaches will be notified of campers found responsible of any damaged or missing property.

Early arrival/late departure: Although campers should make every effort to plan their travel to Life based on their camp start and end date, procedures are in place for most camps to accommodate 1 day early arrival and 1 day late departure for those campers who are traveling from long distances and need to work around flight schedules. Please email camp director for details.

Security and Personal Safety

Residence hall rooms and windows should be locked when not occupied. Residence hall entrances remain locked at all times.

Smoking: Tobacco use is prohibited on The Life University campus.

Fire safety: All safety regulations must be followed. When a fire alarm sounds, campers must evacuate the building immediately. Tampering with fire equipment, including fire extinguishers, smoke alarms and alarm boxes, is a violation of law and carries a fine of up to \$1,000. Complete fire safety regulations are posted in the residence halls and are reviewed during meetings with residential staff.

Motor Vehicles: The operation of motor vehicles by residential campers is prohibited. Commuter or Day campers may only use motor vehicles for transportation to and from Life University. Campers who must commute to campus by car are required to obtain a parking permit from their Camp Counselors.

In accordance with the Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (the “Clery Act”), the Department of Campus Safety is required to publish an annual security report of crime statistics. Property: Campers are urged not to bring valuables to campus. Campers are strongly encouraged to walk in groups and always let someone know where they are going. A camper should not leave the residence hall area alone after dark. The University is not responsible for personal property of camper, including items delivered to the University on the camper’s behalf and property in individual rooms. It is strongly urged that all campers have personal property insurance to protect from loss or damage due to theft, fire, flood, vandalism, and any other hazards.

The University reserves the right to remove unidentified/unclaimed items from all areas in the residence halls. Campers wishing to claim items left behind should contact Campus Safety at: 770-426-2911.

Campers who are dismissed from a camp are responsible for packing their belongings and returning their key immediately upon departure. If a camper is not able to pack their belongings before departing from campus, the belongings will be inventoried, packed, and shipped by a third-party vendor contracted by the University at the camper’s own expense. The University is not responsible for lost or damaged property that may occur in packing and shipping.
